To the President of the European Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker

Brussels, 14 September 2016

President,

The European Organisation of Military Associations (EUROMIL) is an umbrella organisation composed of 35 military associations and trade unions from 21 countries. It is the main Europe-wide forum for cooperation among professional military associations on issues of common concern. EUROMIL strives to secure and advance the human rights, fundamental freedoms and socio-professional interests of military personnel of all ranks in Europe and promotes the concept of "Citizen in Uniform". As such, a soldier is entitled to the same rights and obligations as any other citizen. EUROMIL particularly calls for recognition of the right of servicemen and -women to form and join trade unions and independent associations and for their inclusion in a regular social dialogue by the authorities.

EUROMIL listened with great interest to your state of the union address at the European Parliament today. We agree that "if we wish to maintain influence in the world, we need to work together". Your plans for establishing a permanent European Headquarter to structure and institutionalise European military cooperation are – from our point of view – timely and necessary.

EUROMIL equally welcomed the declarations of several European heads of states and governments as well as high ranking EU officials during the last months on the need for more and better coordinated European defence. Since its foundation in 1972 EUROMIL is of the opinion that the different European armed forces should train and work more and better together. A closer cooperation of our armed forces growing towards a European defence union and even a European army is the key factor for a true and powerful Common Security and Defence Policy.

However, the implementation of a European defence union also has a social dimension. Every day hundreds of thousands men and women serve in the armed forces. They are motivated armed forces personnel and deserve to be treated with respect. They must be able to execute their duties under the best conditions and this is true not only for the field of training and equipment but also for the social field. As already stated, EUROMIL promotes the concept of "Citizen in Uniform" and is therefore of the opinion that military personnel should be treated as every other worker. EUROMIL is convinced that executing a very specific task guaranteeing national peace and security is no obstacle to the enjoyment of the most basic fundamental rights and freedoms.
