

Meanwhile in Ukraine

Ukrainian Union of Military and Security

On the morning of February 7, Russian forces launched another massive air attack on Ukraine, including a missile strike on Kyiv. Russia attacked Ukraine with 64 missiles of various types and kamikadze drones. Mykolaiv, Kharkiv and Kharkiv region, Dnipropetrovsk region, Lviv region, Kyiv region and Kyiv came under enemy attack.

In Holiivskyi district of the Ukrainian capital city, pieces of missiles caused a fire in an 18-story apartment building. Several floors were damaged. 4 citizens were killed and 39 were injured here. Rescuers saved 28 people from the damaged building. Psychological assistance was provided to 85 people. 157 people were left homeless because their apartments were destroyed by Russians. Pets were also rescued from the fire and ruins, some of them died. A car repair workshop and vehicles also caught fire. Civilian infrastructure, including high-voltage cables, was damaged in Dniproviskyi district of Kyiv.

Josep Borrell, High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy visited Kyiv that day.

Borrell spent the morning of February 7 in a Kyiv shelter due to Russia's massive attack on Ukraine.

After that he visited the area affected by shelling, where he was able to see the destruction with his own eyes, and talked with local residents.

Later High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy held a number of meetings with representatives of the Ukrainian authorities and made a speech in Verkhovna Rada (the Parliament of Ukraine).

Russians have been waging wars in Ukraine for many centuries. On February days, a little more than a hundred years ago another bloody attack by the Russians took place in Kyiv. Immediately after the October Revolution of 1917, the Bolsheviks turned to political terror. Since the autumn of 1918, terror acquired the status of official policy of the Soviet government, which was confirmed by the decree. The document legitimized violence as a way for the Bolsheviks to achieve and maintain power.

But in Ukraine, the «Red Terror» was launched from the first days of the invasion of Bolshevik troops in early 1918. On February 8, 1918, the troops of Ukrainian People's Republic which was supplanted by the enormous forces of the Russians, retreated from Kyiv. The Bolsheviks, led by commander Mikhail Muravyov, took control of the city. Here they carried out a bloody massacre. In «Order No. 9» dated February 4, Muravyov ordered the revolutionary armies of the Eastern Front to «mercilessly destroy all officers, cadets, Haydamaks, monarchists and all enemies of the revolution». For three days, robberies, searches, and murders took place. Up to 5000 people became victims of the «Red Terror» in Kyiv in January-February 1918.

Kyiv art critic Fedir Ernst testified: «The corpses of the shot people were carried on carts by draft horses throughout the city — 10-15 people each, piled onto the carts, uncovered, in contorted positions, covered in blood — in whole rows». As we can see, Russia's methods remain unchanged. Ukraine has already experienced all the horrors and war crimes committed by the Russians that we see today. The Russians simply have more means for their dirty deeds.

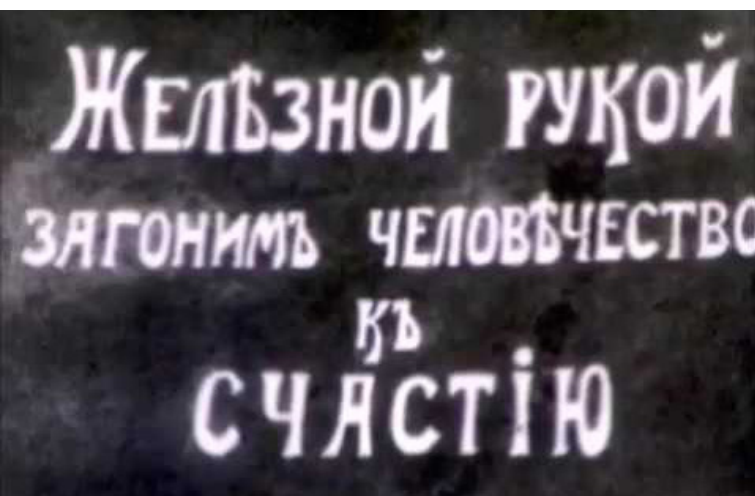

Russia used two North Korean missiles for attack on Kharkiv

The Russians struck an industrial zone in the Slobidskyi district of Kharkiv at 06:00 on February 7. Three people were injured.

Russia used two North Korean missiles to strike Kharkiv on February 7. The Head of the investigations department at the main directorate of the National Police of Ukraine in the Kharkiv region Serhii Bolvinov said this in a post on his Facebook page.

Bolvinov said that two of the five missiles fired at Kharkiv that morning were made in North Korea. Metal fragments of ballistic missiles were collected by explosives experts at an industrial zone. «According to preliminary conclusions by specialists, these are North Korea's HVASON 11GA (KN-23) missiles,» he reported.

The city of Kharkiv and the Kharkiv region suffer daily from constant attacks by the Russian army. This is a borderline region near Russia, so here the enemy tests literally all types of weapons that they have. Not only the Ukrainian military servicemen, who are courageously and devotedly holding back the enemy, suffer from these attacks, but also the civilian population and infrastructure.

«Russian troops destroy the houses of civilian people every day.

Just a few minutes ago, a person had their own apartment, a place of peace and stability, and a moment later — a wasteland, destroyed by flames. After all, this is all that many Ukrainians have. And there is nothing left of the former life, often life itself no longer exist,» she inscribed.

The artist, who

created her watercolor work after another Russian attack on Ukraine, also noted that Ukrainians pay a terrible price.

«Each of us is at risk of dying from shelling every day,» she said.
